Press Release – Dept for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport

The Government is continuing to provide funding for Primary Schools in 2015- 2016 to provide ‘**new, substantial primary school sport funding**’. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Eligible Schools

Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary-aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as at the annual schools census in January 2015.

All schools with 17 or more primary-aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £500 per pupil.

Purpose of the funding

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

For example, you can use your funding to:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils’ participation in the [School Games](#)
- run sports activities with other schools

Accountability

Schools will be held to account for how they spend the sports funding. Ofsted have strengthened its coverage of sport and PE within the Inspection Handbook and supporting guidance, so that schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed within the revised framework.

Schools are required to include details about their sporting provision on their school website, alongside their curriculum details, so parents can compare provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.

Best Practice

Schools will be able to draw on information on effective practice taken from case studies provided by the very best schools. One year on, Ofsted will carry out a survey reporting on the first year's expenditure and its impact.

Funding period

The sports premium continues to be paid to schools in 2015 – 2016. Payments were also received in the previous two academic years, 2013-2014 and 2014 – 2015.

Use of the Sports Premium Funding at Camblesforth CP School

Analysis of the Impact of Sports Premium Funding

in the academic year 2014 – 15

At Camblesforth Primary School, we recognise the contribution of Physical Education to the health and wellbeing of pupils. We believe that high quality physical education not only allows pupils to develop physical development, movement skills and body confidence; but also contributes to physical, mental and social well-being.

In the academic year 2014 – 15, Camblesforth CP School received a total of £7895 to develop Sport within the school.

We aim to provide a varied programme of high quality sporting activities which enable all pupils to develop positive attitudes towards physical activity and healthy lifestyles. We are committed to ensuring that the funding is used to benefit all pupils, regardless of their sporting ability.

In order to facilitate the above, we plan to make use of the sports funding to:

- Continue to enhance participation in sporting activities by providing after school sports clubs for pupils
- To train a member or staff to deliver a Change4life club during the lunchtime period
- Introduce 'Sport to the Beat' and other clubs aimed at 'harder to reach' pupils
- Continue to develop the expertise of teaching staff by providing regular opportunities to work alongside sports coaches and PE consultants
- Provide support and training for one member of staff to undertake the role of Sports Co-ordinator due to the departure of the previous subject leader
- To further develop the planning of PE to ensure that all lessons reflect the development assessment, 'core tasks', the revised curriculum and best practice in PE
- To further extend opportunities for pupils to participate in sporting events with other schools
- To purchase resources necessary to provide a variety of sporting activities for pupils
- To increase opportunities for swimming so that all children are able to swim a minimum of 25 meters at the end of Year 6

- Continued membership of a Local Schools' partnership which provides inter-school competitions, staff training, network meetings for PE subject leaders and access to a specialist teacher to deliver sessions for pupils and staff within school
- To enable all pupils in Year 4 and Year 6 to participate in a residential 'outdoor and adventurous' activity course

The breakdown of spending for the academic year 2014 – 15 is as follows:

Participation in Sports Partnership	All pupils given opportunity to participate in a wide variety of sporting activities with pupils from other schools. Staff accessed CPD activities and worked with expert teacher to strengthen provision within school. (Further information can be found on the 'Sports' section of the school website) The school successfully gained the 'Silver Games Mark'.	£1771
Releasing sports co-ordinator to attend meetings and CPD events prior to dissemination within school	Sports subject leader attended CPD and network meetings to enable her to develop sport within the school. This includes meetings with the sports partnerships above.	£500
Enabling participation in sporting events within the local cluster of schools (transport costs)	Pupils benefited from the opportunity to participate in events against other schools. Pupils accessed specialist facilities and activities not available within the school setting which has been very motivational. Children enjoy the challenge and are able to develop transferrable skills to improve their performance in related sporting activities.	£80
Sports coaches working in school with both pupils and staff in order to enthuse pupils and provide CPD for teaching staff	Staff and pupils benefited from working with specialist coaches in a range of sports including football, multi-skills, and dance. This enthused pupils and enabled them to improve their skills whilst also improving the ability of teachers to deliver high quality lessons within school.	£1050
After school clubs – including Change for Life	The percentage of pupils accessing extra-curricular sports increased from 12% in 2013-14 to 42% in 2014-15. The greater variety of sports available widened opportunities for pupils. More reluctant pupils participated in Change for Life club activities and staff have received training to deliver this on site. As a result, pupils have become more active with the resulting health benefits.	£1617
Sports to the Beat initiative	This was introduced to improve the fitness of pupils across the school and aimed to engage all pupils – especially the more reluctant. Staff also had the opportunity to participate in sessions for CPD purposes. Pupils were very positive about the sessions and the vast majority (92% when surveyed) stated that they wanted to continue with these sessions in their PE lessons.	£1350

	Staff are now confident to include elements of dance and 'sport to the beat' in their teaching.	
Funding to support additional swimming sessions for Y4/5/6	The number of pupils accessing swimming was increased with all pupils in Y4/5/6 accessing swimming lessons. Previously only Y5/6 pupils have accessed swimming and concern was raised about the number of pupils not able to swim 25m at the end of KS2. The year 4 pupils made good progress in lessons with all being able to swim at least 10m and 50% achieving 25m by the end of the sessions. These pupils will access swimming again in 2015-16 with the aim of enabling all to reach the expected standard.	£500
Swimming gala	Pupils in Y5/6 participated in competitive swimming for the first time. This raised the status of the activity and pupils were motivated by the opportunity to compete against other schools.	£20
Trophies and Medals for sporting events	Pupils sporting achievements recognised and celebrated at the end of year 'Awards Night'.	£33
Funding to enable all pupils to attend residential	All pupils in years 4 and 6 given the opportunity to experience outdoor and adventurous activities at a specialist centre. Pupils observed to grow in confidence and develop the ability to work positively as a member of a team.	£530
Bikeability (additional staffing costs)	All pupils in Y6 given the opportunity to develop cycling skills including road safety awareness prior to going to secondary school. Promoting the benefits of cycling for health, enjoyment and environmental reasons.	£66
Positive Play initiative	Increasing the opportunities for pupils to engage in active play during lunch time period. Lunchtime supervisory staff given training and ideas to encourage pupils to take part in a wider range of activities at lunchtime. Pupils given access to a range of equipment to encourage active play.	£86
Introducing Orienteering – mapping of the school and staff training costs	All classes took part in orienteering activities following the mapping of the school. All pupils enthused, particularly the more reluctant pupils.	£292
Staff training and Supply 'cover' costs	Pupils have benefited from at least good teaching in a range of sports due to the increased confidence of staff to deliver a wider range of sports/PE activities. Skills development has been an area of focus and pupils are beginning to develop a greater understanding of how to improve their work as a result. Improvements in the planning and assessment of PE has had a positive impact on progress within lessons and over time.	£1020
